

Páxaat Sapálwit: This week, we'll be talking about our daily schedules and the things we do.

We'll also look at an additional verb tense that indicates things done regularly or habitually.

On Thursday or Friday, you are going to present your daily routine to the class, choosing 5-6 things you do in a typical weekday and telling us when you do them. Like your introduction from last week, this is a spoken presentation, not a reading. You need to have at least three pictures as well to show your fellow students as you speak – these can be of you or anyone else.

Mish mash wa wiyáxayxt? What are your days like?

Last week, we looked at verbs with *-sha*. This indicates an ongoing action – similar to the English suffix *-ing*:

<i>tkw'anátisha</i>	'walking'
<i>Tkw'anátishaash</i>	'I'm walking'
<i>Tkw'anátishaam</i>	'you are walking?'
<i>Itkw'anátisha</i>	's/he's walking'

The suffix *-xa* / *-nxa* / *-inxá* indicates that something is done habitually or regularly. (For now, memorize the whole word and don't focus on the variation between *-xa*, *nxa* and *-inxá*.)

<i>Kútkutinxaash.</i>	I work.
<i>Skúulixaash.</i>	I go to school.

<i>Áksisaysixaash.</i>	I exercise.
<i>Aníxaash tkwátat.</i>	I make dinner.
<i>Pnúwataxaash.</i>	I go to bed.
